CHECK THIS FIRST

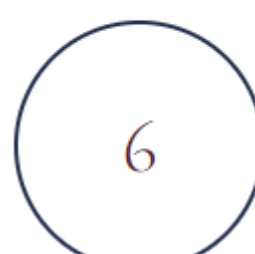
Printers rescale silently. Hold a ruler against the line below — it must measure exactly 50 mm. If it does not, reprint with scale set to 100% and "fit to page" turned off.



METHOD A · MEASURE A RING YOU ALREADY OWN



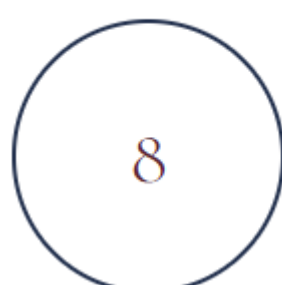

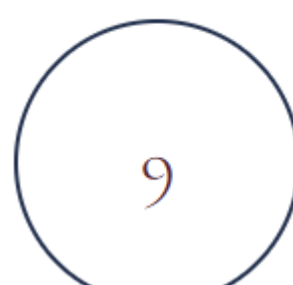

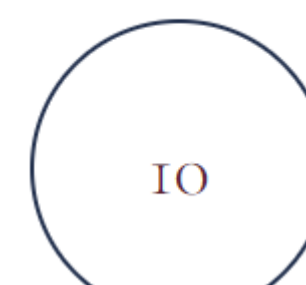

USING A RING

- 1 Choose a ring that fits the exact finger you intend to wear the new piece on.
- 2 Place it over the circles. The circle should sit inside the band and meet its inner edge.
- 3 If the ring falls between two circles, take the larger size.

USING A PAPER STRIP

- 1 Cut a strip of paper no wider than 5 mm.
- 2 Wrap it around the base of the finger — snug, and still able to pass the knuckle.
- 3 Mark the overlap, lay it flat, measure to the mark in millimetres.
- 4 Match that number to the "around" figure above.

NOTES

Measure at the end of the day, at room temperature. Fingers are smallest in the morning and in the cold.

Wide bands sit tighter than thin ones. If you fall between two sizes on a wide band, take the larger.

Whole sizes 5–10. If a ring needs adjusting, we reimburse local resizing up to \$40 within 90 days.
